by default reading rate words correct per minute is not a major factor influencing students 39 levels on literably if a student reads at or below 7 wcpm literably will not level the student up regardless of accuracy and comprehension otherwise reading rate does not impact students 39 levels

1 accuracy this score is based on the percentage of words read correctly the actual of errors is recorded onto the computer on the score input screen and or class roster 2 fluency rate this score is the number of words read per minute to obtain a score of 1 2 3 or 4 the number of minutes and seconds must be entered on the score

fluency passage assessments reading a z

assess reading fluency with two types of assessments the first type of fluency assessment is a one minute timed reading of a passage to measure the number and accuracy of words read there are fluency passages at various levels of text complexity

students who are being assessed at a dra level 14 60 are timed and the number of words read per minute wpm is calculated the wpm must fall within an acceptable range for the level students who are being assessed at a dra level a 12 are not timed and wpm is not calculated

procedure for calculating words correct per minute one minute reading total words read errors words correct per minute select two or three brief passages from a grade level basal text or other grade level material regardless of students 39 instructional levels have individual students read each passage aloud for exactly one minute

## **fluency practice passages reading a z**

fluency practice passages improve reading speed and accuracy with repeated readings of fluency practice passages students orally read passages designed for one minute readings several times with appropriate expression and smoothness to increase reading rate resulting in improved focus on comprehension view our fluency standards table for

## **understanding your child 39 s dra reading level scholastic**

after the test is evaluated and scored your child is assigned a numeric or alphanumeric for very early readers dra level a1 through 80 children with stronger reading abilities yield higher numbers teachers are easily able to give children books they can read by choosing a text with the corresponding dra level

*how to interpret the dra scores the classroom*

step 3 divide the score range by the number of testing periods to get a rough estimate of where your child should score at different points during the school year for example if your child is in the first grade and takes the test four times during the year subtract 6 from 18 and divide that result 12 by 4 to obtain 3 for an on level
