The Bush Tragedy - Jacob Weisberg 2008-01-15

Cheney, whose obsessive quest to restore presidential power and protect the country after 9/11 caused Bush and America to lose the world's respect; and, finally, Donald Rumsfeld and Condoleezza Rice, who encouraged Bush's foreign policy illusions and abetted his flight from reality. Delving as no other biography has into Bush's religious beliefs—which are presented as at once opportunistic and sincere—*The Bush Tragedy* is an essential work that is sure to become a standard reference for any future assessment.
