It is done through properly explaining why you went out of status in the first place and how you have rectified the situation and will be able to maintain proper status in the U.S. at school. This is a very important application as it is one of the few that simply forgets all the time you were out of status and illegal and allows you to move forward with your life and education if granted. Without having the F-1 reinstated, you simply cannot continue with your education, nor can you apply for the H-1B work permit, nor can you later apply for the PERM, I-140 employment petition and ultimately, the adjustment of status application. While you could leave the U.S. and try to just get another F-1, the problems are not that easy. You would not be subject to the 10 year bar. However, because you were out of status, the consular official could deny another F-1 based on his or her belief that you do not intend to follow the terms of the F-1 Visa and/or that you will not return back to your home country once the education is done.
