Jacques Garcia - Franck Ferrand 1999

Jacques Garcia is one of the most fashionable interior designers in France today. His re-created rooms seem to bear the traces of generations, but are in fact the product of his inspired and irreverent imagination and attention to detail. The magnificent, ongoing restoration

and decoration of his Normandy chateau, Champs de Bataille, attracts visitors from the world over and is a monument to his art and creativity.
