Mario Rigoni Stern was born in 1921 in Asiago, in the mountains of northeastern Italy. During the devastation of the First World War, the occupation and ultimate destruction of his village, and his own internment in an Austrian camp, it is Tonle's loyalty to his roots

and his stubborn devotion to his task as a shepherd that persist and make him a quiet symbol of heroism and human endurance.
