In recognition of the trend, Ducati entered into a new market segment when it launched its power cruiser Diavel in November 2010, while Moto Guzzi has its Aquila Nero range ... these and many other custom-style bikes have been well-received in the customs scene. This book looks at some of the fascinating custom projects around the world, accompanied by stunning photography of the finished bikes. Auszug: Die Ducati 916 ist ein Motorrad der Kategorie Supersportler/Superbikes des italienischen Herstellers Ducati. Sie war das erste Modell der Reihe 748 / 916 / 996 / 998. Die 916 wurde zunächst zur 1999 eingeführten 996 und schliesslich zur 998 weiterentwickelt. Die Entwicklung betraf im Wesentlichen den Motor. Das Design änderte sich nur in Details. Anders als die Modellbezeichnungen vermuten lassen, war der grösste Entwicklungsschritt der Wechsel zum sogenannten Testastretta-Motor mit

Einführung der 998 im Jahr 2002. Die im Rennsport entwickelte Neukonstruktion war nicht nur leistungsstärker, sondern auch belastbarer. Als die Modellreihe 2004 mit der 998 auslief, war bereits der Nachfolger 999 erhältlich. Mit der 916 löste Ducati 1994 die 888 ab. Durch die stetige Weiterentwicklung der 916-Baureihe gelang es Ducati seine jahrelange Dominanz in der Superbike-Weltmeisterschaft fortzuführen. Die Maschine sorgte seinerzeit durch das spektakuläre Design von Massimo Tamburini und Sergio Robbiano und durch innovative technische Lösungen für Aufsehen. Sie war eines der ersten Serienmotorräder mit den Auspuffschalldämpfern unter der Sitzbank ("underseat"). Dieses später von vielen Herstellern übernommene Designmerkmal hatte bei der 916 nicht nur aerodynamische Gründe. In Verbindung mit der platzsparenden Einarmschwinge ermöglichte es eine leistungsfördernde Gestaltung der.

1970s: the Marianna, desmo 125 single, Mach 1, 750 and Pantah. Taglioni also instigated Ducati's return to racing, and victory in the 1972 Imola 200 was the turning point. Mike Hailwood rode the 900 Ducati to victory in the 1978 Isle of Man Formula One race and Tony Rutter took four World TT2 Championships. Cagiva purchased Ducati in 1985, bringing a new engineer, Massimo Bordi, and new designs – most famously the Desmoquattro. In various guises, this model dominated the World Superbike Championship during the 1990s, particularly in the hands of Carl Fogarty. Landmark models included the 916 and Monster, and, with the sale of Ducati to the Texas Pacific Group in 1996, the company continued to grow. The racing programme expanded to MotoGP and new model families were introduced. With control taken by the Italian company InvestIndustrial in 2006, Ducati embarked on the next era of development, Casey Stoner winning the MotoGP World Championship in

2007. Now under the Audi umbrella Ducati continues to thrive. This new edition includes a brand new chapter featuring all the models from 2012 up to 2018. Ian Falloon is one of the world's foremost motorcycle historians, with numerous books including The Ducati 750 Bible, Ducati 900 Bible and The Moto Guzzi Story. He has forty years of experience with Ducati, and a collection of motorcycles that includes the 1973 Ducati 750 that he bought in 1976.
