Writing in English, German, or French, more than 300 authors provide a historical description of the beginnings and of the early and subsequent development of thinking about language and languages within the relevant historical context. The gradually emerging institutions concerned with the study, organisation, documentation, and distribution are considered as well as those dealing with the utilisation of language related knowledge. Special emphasis has been placed on related disciplines, such as rhetoric, the philosophy of language, cognitive psychology, logic and neurological science.

Praxis of Retelling Parables and Miracles - Beschi Jeyaraj

A bible theological didactic is not principally reduced to learning and teaching Bible alone but rather extended to understanding and interpreting Bible in one's own religious and pedagogical context. Bible didactic, moreover, does not circumscribe itself only to biblical knowledge in virtue of deducing some abstract and moral principles, but it rather prospects to strengthen and reconstruct one's identity within the choices offered by culture and context. This book aims to engage in an intercultural interpretation of the parables and the miracles of Jesus by dialoging with the culture of Tamils. This comparative study subsequently proposes an alternative synchronic hermeneutic in biblical didactics replacing a deep-seated diachronic model in Tamil land. It also develops a model of sync-culturation superseding fossilised model of inculturation. This book capitalises Tamils' texts and narratives of masses reflected in the archives of Tamil literatures and legends in the process of theologisation. Bearing on the aesthetics of parables and miracles and contextual reading of them, this study brings forward 'the world in front of the text' leaving behind the conventional exegesis of 'the world behind the text'.

Quantitative Linguistik / Quantitative Linguistics - Reinhard Köhler 2005-01-01

Over the past two decades, statistical and other quantitative concepts, models and methods have been increasingly gaining importance and interest in all areas of linguistics and text analysis, as well as in a number of neighboring disciplines and areas of application. The term "quantitative linguistics" comprises all scientific and technical approaches which use such terms and methods in the analysis of or work with language(s), texts and other related subjects. The 71 articles in this handbook, written by internationally-recognized experts, offer a broad, up-to-date overview of the scientific-theoretical principles, the history, the diversity of the subject areas studied, the methods and models used, the results obtained thus far and their applications. The articles are divided up into thirteen chapters: the first chapter includes contributions on the basic principles and the history of the field, nine additional chapters are dedicated to individual descriptions of the levels of linguistic research (from phonology to pragmatics) as well as typological, diachronic and geolinguistic questions. The next two chapters include a description of important models, hypotheses and principles; selected areas of application; and references to neighboring disciplines. Der Titel "Sprache als Form" indiziert eine zentrale Programmatik der wissenschaftlichen Arbeiten von Utz Maas, dem der vorliegende Band zum 60. Geburtstag gewidmet ist. Dieser Titel verweist zugleich auf die damit verbundenen Möglichkeiten der Übereinstimmung und des Dissenses. Der Band ist in vier Teile untergliedert. Unter der Überschrift "Sprachliche Form und Theorie" sind Beiträge versammelt, die Problemstellungen sprachwissenschaftlicher Theoriebildung behandeln. Teil II, "Formbildungen", enthält empiriebasierte Analysen sprachlicher Formbildungen und damit verbundener theoretischer

Problemstellungen. Unter Teil III sind Beiträge gruppiert, die die "sprachliche Form im Medium der Schrift" zum Thema haben. Teil IV, "Ränder", schließlich nimmt solche Texte auf, die entsprechende Problemstellungen aus der Perspektive angrenzender Disziplinen behandeln.

**Reduplikationen Im Türkischen** - Hans-Georg Müller 2004  
Im Mittelpunkt dieser Untersuchung stehen die türkischen IntensivAdjektive (yeni - yepyeni, mavi - masmavi, sert - semsert, temiz - tertemiz). Die Regeln ihrer Bildung waren bisher unbekannt. Durch Anwendung morphophonologischer Analysemethoden konnten schliesslich im Rahmen dieser Arbeit auf der Basis eines umfassenden Korpus die Bildungsregeln herausgefunden, beschrieben und erklärt werden. Ihnen liegt das Kontrastprinzip der Identitätsvermeidung zugrunde, d.h. die Bildung dieser emphatischen Adjektive beruht auf der Vorschaltung eines Morphems, das durch besondere Segmentierung - Reduplikation einer (Teil)Silbe, die durch kontrastreiches Zusatzmaterial aus der Menge der Laute {p, s, m, r} geschlossen wird - und durch eine für das Türkische aussergewöhnliche Akzentuierung - Betonung der ersten Silbe - jenen Signalcharakter erhält, der der beabsichtigten Wirkung der Emphase Rechnung trägt. Zum ersten Mal wird hier "Kontrast" nicht nur qualitativ verstanden, sondern auf der Basis von Artikulationsort und art der Konsonanten auf quantitative Weise definiert und so objektiviert. Um zusätzliche Evidenz für die gefundene Lösung dieses alten türkischen Problems zu bekommen, wurden 1. sämtliche Reduplikationsformen des Türkischen bestimmt, klassifiziert und zum Vergleich herangezogen, 2. umfangreiche Lautstatistiken erstellt, 3. zahlreiche synchrone und diachrone Untersuchungen angestellt und 4. ein Massentest mit türkischen Muttersprachlern zur Verifizierung der gefundenen Regeln durchgeführt.

*Germania Semitica* explores prehistoric language contact in general, and attempts to identify the languages involved in shaping Germanic in particular. The book deals with a topic outside the scope of other disciplines concerned with prehistory, such as archaeology and genetics, drawing its conclusions from the linguistic evidence alone, relying on language typology and areal probability. The data for reconstruction comes from Germanic syntax, phonology, etymology, religious loan names, and the writing system, more precisely from word order, syntactic constructions, word formation, irregularities in phonological form, lexical peculiarities, and the structure and rules of the Germanic runic alphabet. It is demonstrated that common descent is neither a necessary nor a sufficient condition for reconstruction. Instead, lexical and structural parallels between Germanic and Semitic languages are explored and interpreted in the framework of modern language contact theory.
