Considered by some to be the first example of science fiction, *Frankenstein* has generated an entire genre of literature, films, and plays. *The Picture of Dorian Gray* by Oscar Wilde tells the story of the adventures of a hedonistic youth after having his likeness captured in a painting...and the paintings reflection of those adventures. Heart is widely considered a classic of the Gothic fiction genre and is one of Poe's most famous short stories. *The Turn of the Screw* by Henry James tells the story of a governess caring for two children at a remote estate who becomes convinced that the grounds are haunted. The novella has been adapted numerous times in film, stage, and television and has enjoyed much debate by academics on the true nature of the evil depicted in the story.
