BOOK, MICHAEL J. HORSWELL EXAMINES ALTERNATIVE GENDER AND SEXUALITY IN THE COLONIAL ANDEAN WORLD, AND USES THE CONCEPT OF THE THIRD GENDER TO RECONSIDER SOME FUNDAMENTAL PARADIGMS OF ANDEAN CULTURE. BY DECONSTRUCTING WHAT LITERARY TROPES OF SEXUALITY REVEAL ABOUT ANDEAN PRE-HISPANIC AND COLONIAL INDIGENOUS CULTURE, HE PROVIDES AN ALTERNATIVE HISTORY AND INTERPRETATION OF THE MUCH-MALIGNED ABORIGINAL SUBJECTS THE SPANISH OFTEN REFERRED TO AS "SODOMITES." FELDMAN EXAMINES ARGUEDAS'S OTHER NOVELS TO AUGMENT HER THEORIZATIONS, AND GROUNDS HER ANALYSIS IN A DIALOGUE WITH POLITICAL PHILOSOPHERS WALTER BENJAMIN, JEAN-LUC NANCY, CARL SCHMITT, JACQUES DERRIDA, ERNESTO LACLAU, AND LVARO GARCÍA-LINERA, AMONG OTHERS. IN THE CURRENT POLITICAL CLIMATE, FELDMAN VIEWS THE PROMISE OF ARGUEDAS'S VISION IN LIGHT OF EVO MORALES'S ELECTION AND THE BOLIVIAN PLURALITY PROJECT RECOGNIZING INDIGENOUS AUTONOMY. SHE JUXTAPOSES THE BOLIVIAN SITUATION WITH THAT OF PERU, WHERE

COMPARATIVELY LIMITED PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE TOWARDS CONSTITUTIONAL RECOGNITION OF THE INDIGENOUS GROUPS.
