Beginning in 1946, Elizabeth Hawley worked for Fortune magazine as a researcher. Shortly thereafter, she left both her job and the United States itself to travel the world, and thus began her lifelong attraction to the exotic and remote sovereign state of Nepal. In the years that followed, she began reporting on the political and cultural events taking place in her adopted homeland for

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the likes of Reuters and Time Inc., letting the world in on the strange community of mountaineers, pilgrims and politicians who were descending on Kathmandu, whether in search of adventure, enlightenment or prestige. mountaineering,
admitting addiction to
pushing the bounds of
the possible, or
reveling in his ability
to cut away anything in
life that holds him
back, Twight never
blinks. Along the way,
there is the drama of
new and epic routes,
unbreakable bonds
between climbing
partners, and Twight's
evolution as a climber
and a man. He tells
every story in a unique,
in-your-face style. Kiss
or Kill is not an easy

read. It may scare some readers-but that's the point. "I want this book to help you recognize your own anger, which will help you understand mine", says Twilight.
