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## **Art and Nationalism in Colonial India, 1850-1922** - Partha Mitter 1994

Partha Mitter's book is a pioneering study of the history of modern art on the Indian subcontinent from 1850 to 1922. The author tells the story of Indian art during the Raj, set against the interplay of colonialism and nationalism. The work addresses the tensions and contradictions that attended the advent of European naturalism in India, as part of the imperial design for the westernisation of the elite, and traces the artistic evolution from unquestioning westernisation to the construction of Hindu national identity. Through a wide range of literary and pictorial sources, Art and Nationalism in Colonial India balances the study of colonial cultural institutions and networks with the ideologies of the nationalist and intellectual movements which followed. The result is a book of immense significance, both in the context of South Asian history and in the wider context of art history.

## Introduction to the Study of the Hindu Doctrines - René Guénon 2001

René Guénon's Introduction to the Study of Hindu Doctrines can serve as an introduction to all his later works-especially those which, like Man and His Becoming according to the Vedanta, The Symbolism of the Cross, The Multiple States of the Being, and Studies in Hinduism, expound the more profound aspects of metaphysical doctrines in greater detail. In Part I Guénon clears away certain ingrained prejudices inherited from the 'Renaissance', with its adulation of the Greco-Roman culture and its compensating depreciation-both deliberate and instinctive-of other civilizations. In Part II he establishes the fundamental distinctions between various modes of thought and brings out the real nature of metaphysical or universal knowledge-an understanding of which is the first condition for the personal realization of that 'Knowledge' which partakes of the Absolute.

Words like 'religion', 'philosophy', 'symbolism', 'mysticism', and 'superstition', are here given a precise meaning. Part III presents a more detailed examination of the Hindu doctrine and its applications at different levels, leading up to the Vedanta, which constitutes its metaphysical essence. Lastly, Part IV resumes the task of clearing away current misconceptions, but is this time concerned not with the West itself, but with distortions of the Hindu doctrines that have arisen as a result of attempts to read into them, or to graft onto them, modern Western conceptions. The concluding chapter lays down the essential conditions for any genuine understanding between East and West, which can only come through the work of those who have attained, at least in some degree, to the realization of 'wisdom uncreate'-that intellectual, suprarational knowledge called in the East jñāna, and in the West gnosis.

This is not, however, a coffee table book, it is rather a manual for the construction of special havens for the soul. Vastu shastra (vāstu śāstra) è un tradizionale sistema architettonico indiano proveniente dall'India che si traduce letteralmente in "scienza dell'architettura". Questi sono testi trovati nel subcontinente indiano che descrivono i principi di progettazione, layout, misure, preparazione del terreno, pianificazione spaziale e geometria spaziale. Gli Shastra Vastu incorporano credenze indù tradizionali e in alcuni casi buddiste. I progetti hanno lo scopo di integrare l'architettura con la natura, le funzioni relative di varie parti della struttura e antiche credenze usando motivi geometrici (yantra), simmetria e allineamenti direzionali. Vastu Shastra è la parte testuale di Vastu Vidya, quest'ultima essendo la più ampia conoscenza delle teorie dell'architettura e del design dell'antica India. La conoscenza di Vastu Vidya è un insieme di idee e concetti, con o senza il supporto di schemi di layout, che non sono rigidi. Queste idee e concetti sono piuttosto modelli di organizzazione dello spazio e della forma all'interno di un edificio o di una collezione di edifici, in base alle loro funzioni in relazione tra loro, al loro uso e al tessuto complessivo del Vastu. Gli antichi principi di Vastu Shastra includono quelli per la progettazione del Mandir (templi indù), e i principi per la progettazione e la disposizione di case, città, giardini, strade, opere idrauliche, negozi e altri spazi pubblici. Tra i numerosi trattati sanscriti citati nell'antica letteratura indiana, alcuni sono stati tradotti in inglese. Molte scritture di Agama, Purana e Hindu includono capitoli sull'architettura di templi, case, villaggi, città, fortificazioni, strade, sistemazione di negozi, pozzi pubblici, bagni pubblici, sale pubblico, giardini, sponde del fiume, tra gli altri. In alcuni casi, i manoscritti sono parzialmente persi, alcuni sono disponibili solo in lingue tibetane, nepalesi o del sud dell'India, mentre in altri manoscritti sanscriti originali sono disponibili in diverse parti dell'India. Ci sono molti Vāstu-Śāstras sull'arte

di costruire case, templi, città e paesi. Uno di questi Vāstu Śāstra è di Thakkura Pheru, che descrive dove e come devono essere costruiti i templi. Nel VI secolo d.C. in India erano in circolazione manuali sanscriti per la costruzione di templi sontuosi. I libri di testo di Vāstu-Śāstra includevano capitoli sulla costruzione di case, l'urbanistica e su come villaggi, città e regni efficaci incorporassero templi, corsi d'acqua e giardini in essi per raggiungere l'armonia con la natura. Gli antichi Vastu Śāstras spesso discutono e descrivono i principi della progettazione di un tempio indù, ma non si limitano alla progettazione di un tempio indù. Descrivono il tempio come una parte olistica della sua comunità e definiscono vari principi e una varietà di progetti alternativi per la pianificazione di case, villaggi e città, nonché il tempio, i giardini, gli specchi d'acqua e il natura. Vāstu Śāstra rappresenta un insieme di concetti e conoscenze antichi per molti architetti moderni, una linea guida ma non un codice rigido. Il mandala a griglia quadrata è considerato un modello di organizzazione e non una pianta. Gli antichi testi di Vāstu Śāstra descrivono relazioni funzionali e disposizioni alternative adattabili per vari locali o edifici e servizi pubblici, ma non prescrivono un'architettura obbligatoria definita.

Gandhinagar - Associate Professor of History Ravi Kalia, PH.D. 2004

The culmination of Ravi Kalia's trilogy on the formation of capital cities in postcolonial India, Gandhinagar joins the historian's other two volumes, on Chandigarh and Bhubaneswar, in tracing India's efforts to establish its twentieth-century architectural identity. In following the development of these cities, Kalia recounts India's progression through precolonial, British, modern, and postmodern theory and practice, particularly the architectural ideology propagated by Western architects Le Corbusier and Louis Kahn. Kalia explains that Gandhinagar, the capital of Gujarat in western India, became a battleground for the competing ideals that had surfaced during the building of Chandigarh and Bhubaneswar. The mill owners of the neighboring city of Ahmedabad, backed by Indian architect and planner Balkrishna Doshi, wanted the American Louis Kahn to build Gandhinagar as a worthy rival to Le Corbusier's Chandigarh. There was, however, tremendous political pressure to make Gandhinagar a purely Indian enterprise, partly because the state of Gujarat was the birthplace of Mahatma Gandhi. Doshi and then by American-trained H. K. Mewada, who had apprenticed with Le Corbusier in Chandigarh Kalia shows that, unlike the other two cities, Gandhinagar would become emblematic of Gandhian ideals of swadeshi (indigenous) goods and swaraj (self-rule). Exploring the impact of modernist architecture on India as a whole, Kalia suggests that the style gained acceptance because its parsimonious designs and unadorned spaces never represented a threat to a religiously pluralist country anxious to create a secular identity. He explains how two competing versions of Indian history and ideology - Gandhi's and Jawaharlal Nehru's - employed modernism's ideals for their own separate ends. Serving two masters, as Kalia illustrates, created constrictions and tensions evident in the building of Gandhinagar and in the careers of many Indian architects, including Doshi, Charles Correa, and Achyut Kanvinde.
